



Orientation to Adult HIV Care for Clinicians

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, physician assistants, dentists, dental hygienists, pharmacists and others who provide or plan to provide clinical care to HIV-infected adults.

COURSE DESIGN

Lectures will include overviews of:

- HIV testing and counseling
- HIV pathogenesis, transmission, and primary infection, with regional focus on minority populations
- Recognition of HIV at all stages of infection
- Antiretroviral therapy
- Symptomatic HIV/AIDS and opportunistic infections
- Medical complications in HIV management
- HIV and Oral Health
- Women, pregnancy, and perinatal transmission prevention issues
- Hepatitis and HIV
- Mental health and substance abuse issues and HIV
- Methamphetamine use and clinical HIV care
- Workplace safety and PEP

OPTIONAL CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

SEATEC offers one to three days of clinical training experience to licensed physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses, dentists, and pharmacists. This clinical experience can be scheduled either alone or in conjunction with this course. Clinical experiences occur in a variety of HIV-intensive care settings in Atlanta or in rural facilities in Georgia and North Carolina. There is no extra fee for the clinical experience. The participant or his/her agency is responsible for transportation, lodging, meals and other expenses, unless otherwise agreed upon with SEATEC.
